In the course of this conversation Baba lamented the ^{then} recent sad demise of Arjion, informed Vinayak that Vishnuo had been to Lonavla and that now He was going to Meherabad. But all of a sudden Shri changed His mind, and as the train came to a stop on the station of probably Kheral or Karjat He got down and began to walk here and there on the platform. Not only this, but Vinayak said, he could swear that soon he saw some Parsi ladies coming near to Shri and paying Him their respects on the platform and then, when the train started again Baba did not board it but waved a sign to Vinayak.

While narrating all this, Vinayak again and again maintained that this was not a mere dream or imagination on his part, but an actual ~~experience~~ fact personally experienced by him with open eyes and all his wits about him. In the meanwhile Baba was served with dinner consisting of choice and rich assorted dishes specially prepared for Him. Shri appreciated all the dishes but only took a few morsels and when He finished with the meal, the mandali were conducted in the big hall to dine with the rest of the guests.

The dinner served out to all was also grand and strictly vegetarian. At the outset, on behalf of the mandali Rustamji proposed the toast of the hosts and wished a happy and pious long life for both of the girls whose Kavjoté had been performed that day. The toast was enthusiastically responded to, by all those present there, and the health of the family was drunk with aerated waters instead of the usual wines. The mandali ~~paid~~ full justice to the fine dishes. After the dinner all had a little rest and then at about 1.15. started for the return to Mehrabad. Irrespective of the subtle frowns and veiled contempt displayed by some of the other guests, the whole of the Satha family provided a fine

example of deep devotion to Baba today. All of them did their best in paying their best respects and reverence and considerations to Shri and the during Babas short stay at their place.

After coming back to Meherabad, Shri allowed Ramjo and Baboo to go back again to the station by the empty motor lorry returning to the city, as both of them had to go to Poona by the evening train.

Shri took away the small cupboard of the school-office to the Ashram, promising a bigger one to 'Chauji', and passed about four hours in arranging the Ashram Library on proper basis.

In the meantime a pot full of nice Ice-cream was received from Sathas family and was also distributed by Baba amongst all the Ashramites and the rest of the mandali.

Late in the evening there was a sudden and unfavourable change in the weather, and four or five from the mandali got effected with cold. After the usual Arti and Story telling all went to bed at the usual time in the night. The story tonight was repeated by Rustonji.
