### The Navjote Ceremony

The Zoroastrian holiday Khordad-Sal was ushered in with great enthusiasm by the mandali who got up early this morning at ~~four~~ four-thirty and began to play and blow whistles, bugles, drums, mouth organs and even empty tin boxes that could be laid hands on. As soon as all were out of bed, the mandali decided to march up on the hill and make a demonstration before Baba demanding milk tea on this auspicious day. But the mandali did not have to make any show of their desire as to the surprise of all Shri greeted ~~with~~ them with the remark "Get ready quick for the milk tea which has been specially ordered from 'inside'" And true to his words Baba soon served the mandali with fine tea by his own hands!

As per the arrangements that Khan Sahib had been so good to make, Buasahab Rustamji Aqa-Baidool and Dadachanji started from Duherbund with the six zoroastrian boys at 8.30. for the city. On account of a puncture to one of their car tyres near the city the party was ~~for~~ much inconvenience and delay yet the programme was gone through completely. The ceremonies were finished by twelve o'clock in the noon and after the party was photographed at the fire temple they came to Khusroo Quarters and partook of a fine dinner.

with Khan Sahib and family members. The party returned to Pherabād shortly with the boys and presented the "Swan" preparation to Shri Baba at 4 P.M. at the new seat over the hill. Sweets were then distributed to all the Ashram boys and mandali members.

'Chandji who was late to resume his duties by a few minutes ~~too~~ early this morning was gravely warned by Baba to be punctual and prompt to the minutes about his duties.

The joint-prayer that the school boys recite every morning for a few minutes prior to entering their different classes was abruptly stopped by Baba, <sup>this morning</sup> on the grounds that it did not sound harmoniously. Those boys who did not belong to the Ashram were ~~too~~ asked to back out of the line and the Ashramites were ordered to recommence the recitation in as sweet and systematic tone as possible. The result was alone appreciable. The same arrangement and method was then ordered by Baba to be adopted everyday henceforth.

Wed Thur. 17. 8. 27.

'Chandji was suddenly attacked with fever yesterday. It was as severe as sudden and throughout the day 'Chandji was having a strong temperature. He is removed near Baba's seat since this morning and the fever has subsided by the evening. He has been ordered to pass the night also near the Seat.

In addition to the usual visitors of the day, Mr Dhanjishwar and a young hindoo boy came to see Baba and desired to stay here in Baba's service. Both were allowed to stay on certain conditions. Mr Dhanjishwar was instructed to remain 'silent' (observe Maun) and partake of only one meal every twenty-four hours. The boy was told that he shall have to do whatever

~~whatever~~ kind of work that may be given to him, and when he agreed to this condition, as if to test his bona fides Baba first appointed him as a sweeper to clean the gutters and latrines in the Colony. But finding him ready to undertake the work as per his promise, Baba withdrew the first order and gave him in charge of Buneshet for general work in the Ashram.

Shri remained in the Ashram for nearly four to five hours this evening, returning to Meherabad as late as at eight o'clock. The usual tea party at Kaka's place was therefore enjoyed at the unusual hour of nine at night.

Dr Lyhani was allowed to go to Lonavla for two or three days for some urgent work today.
