

From 5.10.25. The day was rather lively today. The mandali was invited to tea at Arangon in the afternoon when lacy sweets and Bhajas were also freely distributed amongst all. After that singing and musical instrument playing was indulged in in the school till supper time. A Bhajan was held in the Mahärwade - untouchable locality - at Arangon by the school boys <sup>this evening</sup>, when Baba and the mandali ~~also~~ were also present throughout the function.

Here again all were treated to tea. Sri and the mandali dined this evening at Talya's house.

Baba's mother came to see him this evening from Poona.

Wed. 7.10.25. When Baba was as usual sitting in the school looking after the teachers and the touched both, after his rounds in the Dispensary Hospital Girls' school grinding room and Dharashala he came to know that the Arangon Trahars brought in a dead bullock in the Mahärwade and made a feast over it that morning.

Baba immediately stopped the school and asked all the untouchable boys of this village to pack of home immediately. But when at 1 o'clock Baba was assured that the parents of the boys in the school and those who had taken oaths did not participate in this foul business the boys were again taken back. For the afternoon Sri went personally in the village towards the Mahärwade and wrote down the names of all those who had eaten the the rotten flesh. Once again Baba gave out some spiritual explanations through slate writing to the

Thur. 8. 10. '25

Those Butchers whose names had been noted by Sri yesterday came to Him this morning and asked to be pardoned for their sin and slip. They once gave their words not to repeat any more such actions and also agreed that in future if such dead animals came in their way the corpses would be duly buried intact outside the village boundary.

Baba promised them Rs 5/- <sup>per such corpse</sup> as a compensation for the skin of the dead animals which the Butchers usually sold after <sup>using</sup> appropriating the other parts in their dirty bellies, and also forgave the Butchers their latest fault and folly. Baba seemed very ill today and consequently retired to His zhopdi at 7.30 in the evening.

Sat. 10. 10. '25.

A meeting of the party was held in the afternoon when Baba discussed through writings the general questions pertaining to the colony-life.

He particularly remarked that after a few days, although he would continue supervising all affairs, <sup>as usual</sup> he would not be able to play with them as freely as he has been doing with them of late. Then all were warned not come near the place when He was sitting in the "cupboard" <sup>of</sup> the table which formed the new seat. All were also enjoined upon to be very strict and active in their duties. Some time was also passed in jokes and humorous recitations. Alā-Pāls were again played very enthusiastically between 4 to 6 in the evening specially in view of the possibility of Baba not being able to take part in sports so freely in future.

Sun. 11.10.25.

To settle some trouble that has arisen of late between the Arugam Makers Baba came out of his Ghopdi as early as ~~6.30~~<sup>5.30</sup> in the morning and after attending them Shri began his usual inspections and enquiries about all the mandali and the various institutions very diligently.

For Chengal Puranic expositions came off successfully once again this Sunday between 9 & 10.30 A.M.

At 3.30 in the afternoon Baba and Mandali were treated to tea-sweets and Bhajias by Ramchand Malai at his place. After ~~all~~ that the party including Shri himself, repaired to Sitaran Buas place and participated in the annual dinner held in anniversary of Buaji Buas Samadhi at Arugam. When all returned back to Hyderabad one of the party offered to Shri a Pan-Bida which he accepted and ate forthwith, — and thus once again began Pan-eating after the lapse of many months. There was a great rush of the outside visitors today for Babas Darshan.

At 7 this evening Baba declared He would now begin fasting and until further notice He would hereafter ~~eat~~ remain only on water and light-tea without milk. Another noteworthy change about Babas was that instead of retiring for the night in his Ghopdi Shri began to live in the 'cupboard' of the big table forming the 'New-Seal' under a Mimosa tree along the Dhand-Dayar Road and accordingly at 9.15 tonight Baba went in his new 'sleeping room' after all had paid their final respects of the day.
