The mandali were made to observe fast throughout the day. Consequently the usual Thursday tea-party at Mr. Shekhar's house was enjoyed in the morning at 11. 15. instead of in the afternoon.

At tea time Baba also explained to the party through signs and writings the difference between *Yogi & Valis* and *Sadgurus*. Under orders the schools were closed ~~from~~ ⁱⁿ the afternoon. From 2 to 3 Savlaram recited his sweet *Bhajans* accompanied with his excellent 'Tabla' playing and the harmonium. Then followed for some time *Ramayana Puran* which ~~was~~ ~~delivered~~ was delivered very well by Ramabhai Bhutt and Quawalli singing by a chance visitor from Hyderabad Deccan. Thus the whole afternoon was kept ringing with music and singing.

Sitararam Bua of the local village was allowed by Baba to put up a small shop in the colony for the sale of coconuts, ~~and~~ agarbathis, camphor and 'Chana-Turmura' etc since the enormous crowds of visitors from far and near has become a daily feature of the *Inchababad* life. In the evening ^{most of} the party who were fasting since the morning were found to be very hungry by Baba. He enquired of Sitararam Bua how he fared with the Friday day business & in his shop and finding his ~~reply~~ that to be unsatisfactory Baba himself purchased some 'Chana-Turmura' and distributed the same ~~at~~ with his own hands amongst the fasting 'Mandali' who were also allowed to take tea over the dry breakfast.

repeating his abject surrenderance to Beba, Shri decided to hold a tea party at Bapoo Brahami's place.

Beba and the mandali along with the school boys were photographed this evening.

After the night Bhajans Beba permitted Pandora to dine with the non-hindoo party but he discorved at ~~the~~ lengths through writing and signs the necessity of strictly sticking to one's religion in the absence of a Sadguru's order to the contrary and concluded that he had taken the responsibility of Pandora's eating himself.

Besides Sitarambua's shop and the flower shop many more have come into existence when tea is also prepared and served, so the numbers of daily visitors can fairly be placed between two to three hundred.

While ~~on~~ ^{on} Sundays and Thursdays Incherabad becomes a place of a great festival and pilgrimage when a small bazar is formed with the permanent shops and scores of hawkers near the school premises.

But irrespective of any special preference, ^{of any kind} Beba meets and wherever necessary 'talks' through signs & writing with all of them. And yet the Incherabad colony does not escape his extra ordinary hold and vigil over it. Inspite of these crowds and the consequent hum drum every department is frequently made aware through various means the all watching eye of Beba. As a result of which the number of sick, blind, lepers and mad & queer people that are enjoying the Incherabad hospitality get the most careful and regular attendance and service from the mandali and the paid staff.
