

Sun. 17. 10. 26.

In the afternoon a keen cricket contest was held in which Sri took a leading share and which was said to be held specially for the two visitors R & D of the old mandali who have come to see Baba today. At night a mad dog was seen about the colony when Baba ordered ~~him~~ it to

to be given poison and killed, of course after warning the parties concerned to see take precautions so that other persons and animals were not harmed through it.

After some gramaphone playing Shri retired over the Hill at nine o'clock.

Fri. 18.10.26

Sweets and jalebis were distributed or rather a general loot was organised of the same amongst the mandali. The consequent rush and struggle after capturing as much as possible of the sweets gave rise to many funny incidents including Chauji's clean somersault in mid-air.

Between 3 and 4.30. in the afternoon cricket was played by the mandali. At five o'clock Baba and a party of fourteen members (previously selected) went to Bhimpur where Shri was specially invited.

The ceremonies conducted there by Rath Madhav amidst scenes of great rejoicing and enthusiasm proved a huge success. The rush of those who wanted to pay their respects to Baba was so great that Shri and the party had to leave the place very soon to avoid some people being crushed in the great stampede and on-rush. The funniest incident of the affair was of a man who was drunk and yet got into his head to give a military salute to Baba. In the intoxicated state he kept on standing facing Baba at a distance with his hand raised smartly to his forehead in a salute for more than 20 minutes.

It was only when Shri chanced to look in his direction and ~~sighed~~ him returned his salute that the man took down his hand. Reckoning upon

the incident, afterwards, Baba 'said' that for all their faults and ~~bad~~ habits in temperate habits He liked these so-called low caste people such Gahars and Raungs as they have no doubt regard and humility to a degree in contrast to the so-called cultured yet proud and haughty people "It is humility and regard that appeals to me most" added Shree with the usual slant writing.

After the return from Bhujgar, Satta's brother was found to be waiting for Baba with a basket of sweets. The same was distributed amongst all immediately.

An Alā-Palā ~~so~~ match was played with keen interest by all including Baba in the night from eight to ten o'clock when tea was also served to all. Some of the members who had voted for the game were still found to be chit-chatting amongst themselves after quietly slipping out of the play ground namely Behramji, Adi, Ranjoo, and Doctor. At the end of the game these were taken to task and as a punishment were asked to observe silence from 10.30 to 6 o'clock the following morning. After a few minutes however the same order was applied to the whole of the mandali that is not to utter a single ejaculation during the hours mentioned above. A queer but light punishment indeed, considering the main period of silence was to be passed in sleep! Baba as usual went over the Hill for the night but rather late today that is at eleven o'clock.

The morning passed away in usual routine save that Baba discussed and explained some of Hafiz's verses to Doctor Adi & Ramjoo for a couple of hours. However a new life was infused amonst the mandali when the bell ~~was~~ rang ~~vigorously~~ vigorously at three o' clock in the afternoon. In less time than it takes to write this, one after the other, all mandali members flocked in the Makhan. All those assembled were informed to ask for any boon from Baba, for ~~this~~ day only, with a promise that the request supported by a majority will be fulfilled by Shri. All were then supplied with pieces of papers to put in their 'wants' in writing. Minutes of great excitement and guessing followed. When all had finished putting in their desires in folded chhitis in a heap before Baba, one by one they were unfolded and read out. Some of them are reproduced here.

Mohon's : Baba should speak today.

Sailor's : Baba should eat today.

Behramji's : Forgiveness for all sins.

Chandji's : A lecture.

Ramjoo's : A cup of tea, a packet of Pans & a cigarette.

Rustomji's : Tea & tasty sweets.

Doctor's : A cup of Milk tea & meals immediately.

Besides there were some requesting money, service but the majority expressed ^{the desire for} a treat whether of sweets, meals or tea parties and hence Shri wrote :

Today being the last day of my taking meals (as I have to commence my 100 days fast from tomorrow the 20th inst) and as it is the general desire of the majority to enjoy a treat and that I should eat too, I grant the same. I shall partake of the

of the food providing all cooks different dishes with their own hands by 8^o'clock in the evening.

This decision was received with a deafening cheering. Besides a treat, it held forth the excitement of a novel recreation. Immediately different groups were formed, the chief being those under the leadership of the expert cooks in the mandali such as Syed saheb, Masaji and Bomanji to prepare different dishes, and they were supplied with all the necessary utensils and ingredients.

The following three hours were passed with great enthusiasm and joy in cooking the foods with all its consequent hum-drum and excitement. The result was indeed very commendable as will be seen from the following:

Syed saheb & Party -

Rice, curry and Bhajiyas.

Bomanji & Party -

Pulav and Bhagwan stew.

Masaji & Party -

Different vegetable dishes.

Firoz & Party -

Bread.

Kaka's party -

Bhajiyas

Ramjoo & Doctor made a mess of themselves in trying to fry chillies which were eventually all thrown away. All were served with the different-tasty dishes, personally by Baba, seated in the Sai-Durbar.
